Hi Dave,

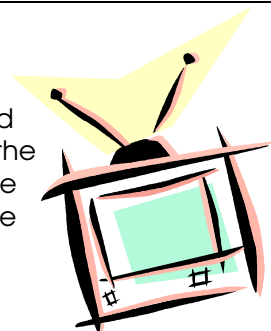

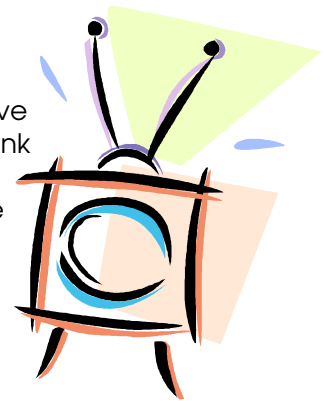

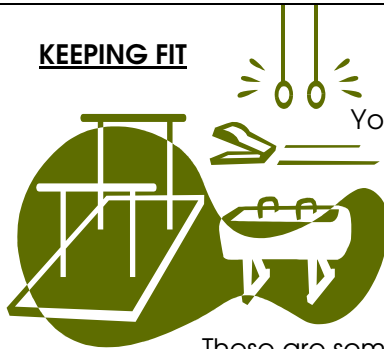
